The weekend of Wonderland kicks off on Friday 27 November with the first 50 visitors to the museum receiving their very own wonderland cupcake and birthday beverage. From 12pm – 4pm you can join in with the Curiosity Roadshow. This will be New Zealand's very own version of *Antiques Roadshow*, providing a great opportunity for the public to bring along their curios and artefacts to have them appraised by the experts from Dunbar Sloane. Who knows what treasure could be unearthed from the family curio cabinet?

On Saturday 28 November from 10am – 1pm kids of all ages can celebrate with the Mad Hatter's Tea Party, a family-focused event with Fifi Colston where children can create their own wonderful hats and cupcake necklaces. There will also be games and activities with the crew from Classic Hits.

For the competitive there is **Play The Game** on **Saturday from 2pm – 5pm**, featuring a giant chess game and bridge matches with the Wellington Chess and Bridge Clubs in attendance. Plus there is a special guest appearance from chess Grandmaster Gawain Jones, one of only two in New Zealand. He's calling for all challengers – and will play against as many at once as can be handled.

The 1933 classic film **Alice in Wonderland** (starring Cary Grant and Gary Cooper) is presented with a delicious twist, screened with a hilarious live re-voicing from comic actors, and with a psychedelic musical score performed live. Screening **outside under the Queens Wharf sails at 9pm** on **Saturday**, Alice's trip down the rabbit hole will take on a whole new dimension!

And rounding out the weekend of wonderment is **The Storybox Project** - a self-contained audio-visual masterpiece that tells the story of Wellington's very own museum spliced with Alice in Wonderland. Storybox runs continuously from **8.30pm – 12am Friday to Sunday.**
