Re -Telling Tales: Digital Design

Digital contraptions creatively re-tell Wellington stories through ingenious and interactive graphical environments in a new exhibition at **Museum of Wellington**.

Students from Victoria University School of Design will each take a contemporary look at one event from the city's colourful 20th century as part of the exhibition *Re–Telling Tales*. From fake fur to arcade–style games, students create the controller that allows the user to experience a more direct form of input than the usual computer mouse.

Curator Vaune Mason says 'this exhibition celebrates the students' artistic creativity in resolving the design issues that accompany an interactive re-telling and allows visitors to be part of the story by engaging with the exhibition.'

Re-Telling Tales is an ongoing exhibition series that presents interpretations of the Museum's permanent exhibition *Telling Tales*, which details 101 stories from Wellington history between 1900 and 2000, using their selected media.
